Global-Mark summary of the main findings and conclusions	<ol> <li>Forico continue to operate an effective FMS to a very high standard of compliance. We commend the management approach in delegations of responsibility and authorities, and the diligence of staff in the practical application of procedures and controls to achieve a sustainable outcome.</li> <li>Three (3) observations were reported, one of which was closed during the audit. There were no non-conformances found.</li> <li>As remarked previously, while commercial forestry is the principal goal, the adoption and implementation of environmental, cultural, and social values remains impressive. Duty of care is taken very seriously.</li> </ol>
Brief description of the FMUs [Forest Management Units]	Hardwood (E. nitens predominantly and some E. globulus) and softwood (P. radiata) plantations and native forest throughout Tasmania.
Brief description of the Defined Forest Area [DFA].	Spread across Tasmania, with the greatest concentration in the north-west. Currently the DFA is 172,970 hectares [Ref FMP 9/22) comprising softwood and hardwood plantations under permanent, and semi-permanent management arrangements, natural forest and other native vegetation areas, land taken up by infrastructure etc.
Guidance as to how to obtain further details of the DFA may be accessed	Forico produce a 6-monthly State of the Estate report that defines the area of forest over which it has management control, and conducts operations, over. Latest issue is 30 June, 2022.
